

Students, here's to you-just relive these moments and smile to yourselves for you are proud Dalians!




I myself, spent many years in boarding school. Both at Sherwood College, Nainital as well as St.

Stephen's College in Delhi, and for a brief while, a year in Santiniketan as well to wander my Indian roots so I very well understand the pressures, and pleasures of living in a boarding school. And so, I want to say that we are part of one very privileged group. We are, literate 1% of the world's population. We are part of that 1% that are educated, have a roof over their heads, have a meal on their tables. That's 1% of 7 billion people. That is the privilege we are born with, which is wonderful. Thank the lord, thank our parents, thank the universe for giving us this extraordinary privilege and giving us so many opportunities to make us a part of the group of people who have the best of this planet. That is a very special blessing and I'm sure we are all aware of it. Beyond that, we are living during the most exciting period of human history. Humans appeared on the planet maybe 2000 or 3000 years ago in the present form as Homo Sapiens. Recorded human history is probably 10,000, 7000, 5000 years old. But let's not go that far. Let's just go back 120 years, what was it like living then? There was no water, no electricity, you had to wash your clothes by hand and cook your food on fires. There were no cars. Perhaps a few trains connecting a few countries and a few cities but the fastest form of transportation was the horse. Airplanes are out of the question; your street lamps were lit like candles every evening. You lived in darkness and the cold, you lived in the extreme heat with no air conditioning, no gadgets, no radio, nothing. Just the last 120 years, we moved to that to the incredible sophistication of computers, technology and every form of software we can imagine, giving us ways to communicate in ways we couldn't even dream of and ways I couldn't even imagine in my childhood. Even in my childhood, you used a typewriter, and

if you made mistakes, you used white paint to retype it. So, to be living in an age with computers, medical breakthroughs, rockets to the moon, when there's more technology in your cellphone that the technology used to take the man to the moon, we are living in extraordinary times.

If that wasn't enough of a blessing, we live in a country which is India. I remember for three years, there weren't any phones at home because the government was the only one that could produce them and for three years there was a waiting list. You had to either bribe someone to get it or to go





happened in your lifetime.

In economic senses, we used to grow at about 2-3% a year. Today it's growing at 6-7%, more than double, it makes an enormous difference. And just in the last nine years, we have had the most extraordinary changes. Airports have doubled, ports have doubled, 400 kilometres worth of highways have been added, we have given bank accounts and health insurance to millions. Systems like UPI, more transactions happening in India compared to the US and China put together. This is the new India. The new India you are growing into which gives you every opportunity in the world.

Of course, this is a problem in itself. When you have so many opportunities, what do you do? Now lot of people will you give 'gyaan' that do this or that. I'm sure you are all smart enough to know what to do with what you have. But you need to be able to ask the right questions. Today,

we are entering the time of A.I. so in a sense, even educational models will change because education teaches you the answer to several questions. What is this times this? When did Ashoka exist? When did Buddha exist? What are stratified rocks? All this knowledge is given to you in several fields. Today, you can ask ChatGPT everything, and in less than a second you have the answers. So having the answers is not necessarily the best advantage in today's world. But learning to ask the right questions, that is a skill you will need when knowledge is available instantly. So, if you want to maximize the changes, learn to ask the right questions.

With all these incredible changes, another thing you have to deal with is when let's say an American comes to India for the first time, he's living in a nice five start hotel, he steps out and suddenly his senses are assaulted by all kinds of sights, sounds and tastes of different places and people. Different cultural things, the way people dress, how they look and feel and are. All of this is

immense sensory input, all of this is new information about new people, new cultures and new countries. It's very exciting but there is still such a thing as an overload and so they go back to the hotel, it feels like America and it gives them more time to process what they've seen, get used to it, put it in its proper place and have a nice bath and go out for tourism the next day. So they are prepared for another round of stimulation etc etc. And they go back absolutely gob smacked by the country, but they go back to America, to familiar surroundings and they talk about it in very comfortable terms.

Now, what they have been through is called culture shock, because you suddenly get the shock of a new culture but because you have the space to go back and process it, you get over it. Then eventually after the whole trip is over and you're stimulated to the max, you go back to America and you process it and you get over the culture shock. You are facing a different kind of shock; you're facing a future shock. Future shock is when the world around you changes and changes rapidly. Today with technology, this change is extremely rapid. And you've got to learn to navigate this change because in future shock, there is no safe harbor to which you go back and say, 'Oh let me think about future shock.' Before you even get over that you are in the next future shock. And before you get over that you are in the next. So how do you deal with this?

Let me give you a quote from Charles Darwin who wrote The Origin of the Species. "The species that survive are not the strongest, they are not even the most intelligent. The species that survive are the ones that learn to adapt." And so, as a species we want to adapt to the ever-changing, fast changing world around you, you have to learn to adapt to it. You have to learn to recognize the new opportunities with it; you have to learn to shed the baggage of the past and embrace the knowledge of the new.

These are not easy things, because it pushes you out of your comfort zone. You have to learn to live

in a different way, a different world. Yes, it's true, we come from a wonderful country, with great traditions, great culture, great roots that have not been shaken for thousands of years, those will never leave us. But, the environment and world in which we live is changing so rapidly that unless the villager learns to do UPI transactions, he will soon not be able to pay with cash and so he has to adapt. Today, I see people scanning things to pay just like that, everything is changing. And the other problem you face is one of abundance. There is WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, TikTok, whatever you have. All these are wonderful things that give us pleasure and it's good to have pleasure. We all need pleasure. We all want pleasure. But if pleasure, takes over and that is all you do, you will produce nothing and become a vegetable. The challenge for you is to get your pleasure from these new wonderful things, but find ways to balance your pleasure and productivity. I myself, planning to check my Instagram for ten minutes end up finding myself there for two hours. And you know, you will think you are young and have all the time in the world. You don't. The day has only got 24 hours, and in those 24 hours, what you do defines your tomorrow. As Gandhi said, "The future depends on what you do today." So don't think you'll do it tomorrow, because tomorrow is just an idea in your head right now. If you want changes in the future, sow the seeds today. And if you spend too much time enjoying the joys of technology without finding ways of making your life richer in terms of knowledge, money, things you do, things you create, things you relate to and even human relations. Then, in the end, that technology will pull you backwards. Here are a few thoughts I want to share with you, without taking too much time. But I do want to ask you to think of one other thing. Coming to a college like Daly, you get the best of knowledge, the best of teachers. They will give you the best of skills, accessing the best the world has to offer.

The brightest man in the world, who rightly said is Einstein, and Eistein said, "Knowledge is not as important as imagination. Because knowledge deals with what is known, imaginations explores everything that can be known and can ever be known.' That creative part of ourselves, that thinks originally should always be kept alive. Keeping your creative self vibrant is very important. Whether it is through creative things you like to do or participate in or perform. It doesn't matter whether you're a banker or a man in the army, you could like to sing, to paint, to admire art. Keep that creative side going, you don't have to be an actor or performer to be creative. Everyone of us is creative and never lose that creativity because that creativity is positivity; that creativity will you give the best ideas in whatever field you work in, that creativity will give you new worlds to explore. And one other thing-learn how to recognize opportunity. It doesn't come with a brass band singing 'I'm Opportunity.' It could be something you overhear at a cocktail party and think 'I could do that' and a whole new company is formed. How do you think these billion-dollar companies exist? Uber, the biggest taxi company in the world doesn't own just one taxi. Zomato doesn't own just one restaurant, yet they are the biggest titans in their fields. Somebody took an idea, realized technology existed, put it to work and suddenly India has created over 200 unicorns. That's billion dollars' worth in companies, just based on ideas young people had who applied technology, took it to a marketplace and found a market for it. Every idea doesn't have to be a billion dollar idea, it could be an idea that gets you a promotion in your company, takes you from an executive to a director, becoming the head of a company. These are people that use their imagination. Always seek to do things in an imaginative way, not the usual routine was in a different way that makes a difference. All these things will make your life much richer. Imagination does not always have to be with work, it could be with personal

relationships, don't just send a card, do something different. Imaginations makes you stand out with people. What you remember about people is not what they did or their achievements, but how they made you feel. Find ways to make people feel good about you, that is the true wealth you will generate. After you are gone, all you leave is the memories you leave behind.

So to sum it up, you live in a very exciting era, surrounded by incredible opportunities no one in history has ever been more fortunate to have and yet you have your challenges because you have to adapt to changing environments. You have to develop your skills; you have to learn the art of asking the right questions. And ask yourself, what makes your heart sing, what would you like to do? The other day, I was watching a show and someone said something wonderful. "Figure out what you love to do, and then figure out what you have to do to do what you love to do." You understand me? If you say you want to be a butterfly collector, then think how much money do I need for my life that I exist comfortably and become a butterfly collector. You will get all the satisfaction you want, because you are doing what you love. So, getting the biggest paycheck isn't the biggest reward, getting the biggest satisfaction, that is the biggest reward.

So, ask yourself, what makes your heart sing? What is it that you love to do? What is it that you can do better than others, that you would like to give to the world? These are the kind of ouestions to ask yourself. Learn the skill of asking ouestions rather than seeking knowledge.




Cookery














The English department traced down the 'First and famous' Indian writers of English novels, portrayed Pandvani and the characters from the popular plays of Shakespeare.



Guided by this philosophy, the Daly Ethos club marked by significant strides and planned a plethora of service projects and activities.

Beginning with a drive for books and clothes, students collected and donated over 2000 textbooks and novels and 800 pairs of clothes to schools including the VAMA School, the Musakhedi slum and Manavta Ki Pebchan NGO.

On the morning of 2nd October, Daly College also celebrated the Service Day, which began with 21 Dalians conducting a Food Distribution Drive at the MY Hospital. The students distributed poba and jalebi made by them at Chefs of DC along with the help of the mess to over 400 people while also interacting with them.

This year, the club also organized a fundraiser during the Annual Cross Country, selling over 1000 friendship bands and chocolates made by students. Moving forward, multiple plantation drives have also been conducted in various parts of the school while students also visited a blind school and interacted with the children.

The students also took on an Education Drive, and taught over 50 slum kids in the Scheme 140 sector over the winters, helping them with understanding of basic concepts and skills.

The students have also launched an innovative project- Eco Bricks. Eco bricks are a sustainable solution to plastic waste management which includes making bricks using plastic bottles and polythene and plastic waste, which are then used in the creation of structures including walls and sit outs. The club has collected and made over 100 Eco Bricks, inculcating in them an understanding of their roles as active citizens. The paper recycling unit has also been used extensively to make many products such as envelopes, greeting cards amidst others.

Overall, the Daly Ethos Club has been a testament to the Dalian spirit of serving society and catalyzing positive impact among their community and beyond.



The commencement of the latest NCC session marked the enrollment of 32 cadets in the inaugural year of the two-year training programme, elevating the overall strength of the Air Wing to 50.
