In Skating, 8 gold, 6 silver, 6 bronze and Aaryn Anand won a gold medal in the 2nd All India National Speed Skating Ranking Championship 2022.

In Squash, 8 gold, 6 silver, 5 bronze and Saharsh Sahara won CKS I Squash Open at Pune and Rajasthan Squash Classics at Jaipur in Boys U-13 category.

In Tennis, 16 gold, 13 silver, 10 bronze and Reet Arora won the All India Tennis Association Championship and earned free Tennis Coaching in Spain. Amishi Shukla secured runners-up position in AITA National Series and Pehal Kharadkar won the AITA Super Series at Jalandhar.

And our laurels extend to other fields too – Basketball, Chess, Cricket & Soccer. Ladies and gentlemen, I feel the connect with the multifarious achievements -particularly in the eight months gone by –a connect of pride At the Udbhav Utsav International Dance and Music Fest 2022, out of the 5 categories we

participated in, DC bagged positions in 4 categories!

In the A level Examinations, Shreyasi Choudhary, Arsh Mohta and Anay Baheti were the stream toppers.

This year again our students have secured admission to many universities across the USA, the UK, Switzerland, Australia and Canada.

As a part of our outreach programmes, our signature projects: Daly College Eye Camp and the Girls' washroom project have received overwhelming responses.

Ladies and Gentlemen, and this evening, we will all witness a spectacular production by the Dalians of Senior School - The Enlightenment.

We all know that Lord Buddha was born on full moonlight, achieved Nirvana on full moonlight, and here we are, presenting excerpts from his life in the week of the full moonlight - Isn't it a cosmic connect ?

Address by the Chief Guest

HH Maharaja Shrimant Jyotiraditya Scindia

Seated on dais with me the Chairman of the Board of Governors, Daly College, Maharaj Dewas, Vice Chairperson of the Board of Governors, Maharaj Narsingharh, members of the Board of Governors present here today, Principal of Daly College, Dr. Gunmeet Bindraji, recipients this year of the RN Zutshi award, which I believe is a tie, Vice Admiral Pandit Sahib and Dinesh Mittalji, members of the faculty, alumni, and most importantly, my young friends, present here today on the 152nd Annual Prize Giving function at our historic Daly College in Indore.

I feel the connect and I'm very glad that today, as we stand below the awning of this wonderfully historic building, a building and a campus and an institution that was envisaged not as a brick and mortar institution but an institution that would have a throbbing heart, an institution that would have an enduring soul and an institution that would imbue in its students and its wards the spirit of good citizenship and most importantly, the talents of what constitutes being a good human being. And I'm glad as we stand below these hallowed portals, in an institution that has always prevailed in terms of being on the cusp of change, bringing about a paradigm shift in the way we think, in the way we operate, in the way that we live, that



institution, envisaged by our founders today has at its head Dr.Gunmeet Bindra as its Principal. India, ladies and gentlemen, has a wonderful future. India is an idea whose time has come. India no longer stands on the Asian firmament as a star.

during that pace of transformation, that pace of change, that voyage that Bharat Mata has embarked upon.

It is imperative that every single citizen of our country must participate in the task of nation building. And if that be the case, 140 crore Indians, for far too long, for many decades and for many centuries, we have believed that only 50% of our population can carry on that task. But if India has to emerge as a world power which is in her grasp today, we cannot do it unless every single citizen, especially our ladies and our women, partake and participate in that task of nation building.

And therefore, on this day, from the bottom of my heart, it pleases me that we have, as the head of our Daly College, a lady who has in her career transformed every institution that she has been part of. Dr.Bindra has the capability of having a carrot and a stick in her approach. And she said to me, 'I must apologize, Your Highness.

This is the first time we are doing the APG at this venue. And I had not forecasted that the sun would be shining so brightly and would be so hot', and I told her that what more would one expect? That on a wintry day you're ensconced within nature, within greenery and,

I'm very nostalgic as well as I stand on this podium in today's ceremony as the Chief Guest. But I am not a guest at Daly College. This is an institution that my forefathers contributed to and built brick by brick as one of the original donors and the original patrons. It is an institution to which, in 1891, Maharaja Madhav Rao Scindia, the First and along with him, Maharaja Shivajirao, Holkar of Indore both donated the first two boarding houses and it is an institution to which the wonderful, historic and astounding Cricket Pavilion was donated by Maharaj Madhav Rao I in 1910.

That pavilion still stands proud and Maharaj Dewas informed me that one of the first events, cultural events, was held at that pavilion. And so therefore, ladies and gentlemen, I do feel the connect. Now to my young students. I have very few words of advice, but important, I feel, words of advice. Your time here is to be treasured.

This is a labyrinth within which, within the safe parameters, you will build the foundation blocks of your future life. My five years at boarding school were the most treasured years of my educational career. This is the labyrinth wherein you will function both as an individual and you will function as a collective personality. This is the environment in which you will learn to excel both as an individual and understand the precepts and the tenets of what it means when we talk about team effort. And this is the environment, especially for my boarders, because this is your home away from home.

Your house-masters and mistresses, your tutors, your teachers, your Principal, take the avatar of your parents in this institution and that's the depth of gratitude that you must carry towards them till the last day of your lives. Because as much as your parents imbue in you values, principles and morals, so does the fundamental core of this

institution in terms of its faculty and its staff. And when I mean faculty and staff, I mean not only the Principal and the teachers and your housemasters and your house mistresses, I mean the laundry in charge in your house, I mean the darban in your house, I mean those who serve you tea in the dining hall because, remember, they are also care givers.

They are part of the pastoral system of this institution. And so my first conversation this afternoon, after meeting the Principal was not with the Dean of academics, was not with the Dean of sports, was not with the Dean of pastoral care, but it was the babu in the Principal's office who has been with this institution for the last 25 years. So make sure you treasure your time here. Build yourself individually and build yourself to be a team player. And along with that building, make sure you ingrain yourself three or four important traits. The first trait is that of perseverance. Never give up. You may experience failure once, you may experience failure twice. But I guarantee you, if you stay the course, if you stay with it, success will definitely be us. And here I'd like to give the example of no one else but Michael Jordan. How many of you have heard of Michael Jordan? Hands up with energy, people in line here. How many of you have heard of Michael Jordan? And what do we know about Michael Jordan? What we certainly know about him is that he's a four-time gold medalist with USA Basketball. He's been a twice Olympic gold meddler and twice he's been the US Basketball male athlete of the year. But how many of us know that at the age of four years, until the age of six, he could not speak! His teachers in school had cast him aside. He had been taken off the Basketball team. But here is an example for you of a person who persevered, persevered and persevered. And today his name is in the hall of fame in the area of sports across the world. And I'd like to quote him. He said, "I've missed more than 9000 shots in my career, 9000. I've lost almost 300 games, 26 times. I've been trusted to take the game

winning shot, 26 times, and I've missed. I've failed over and over again in my life, and that is why I succeed". So perseverance, young friends must beat the core of your existence.

The second attribute that I believe that each of you must have is to make sure that you build a team. Always remember in life, behind every successful leader are people who have taken him or her to that place. The oft-repeated clichéd phrase that we hear that behind every successful man is an even more successful woman. In the case of Dr. Bindra, I can say that behind every successful woman is an even more successful man. You must build a team because always remember that you may have the capability to excel, but you're only as strong as the weakest link in your chain and therefore learn to balance weaknesses with strengths and strengths with weaknesses as you move along.

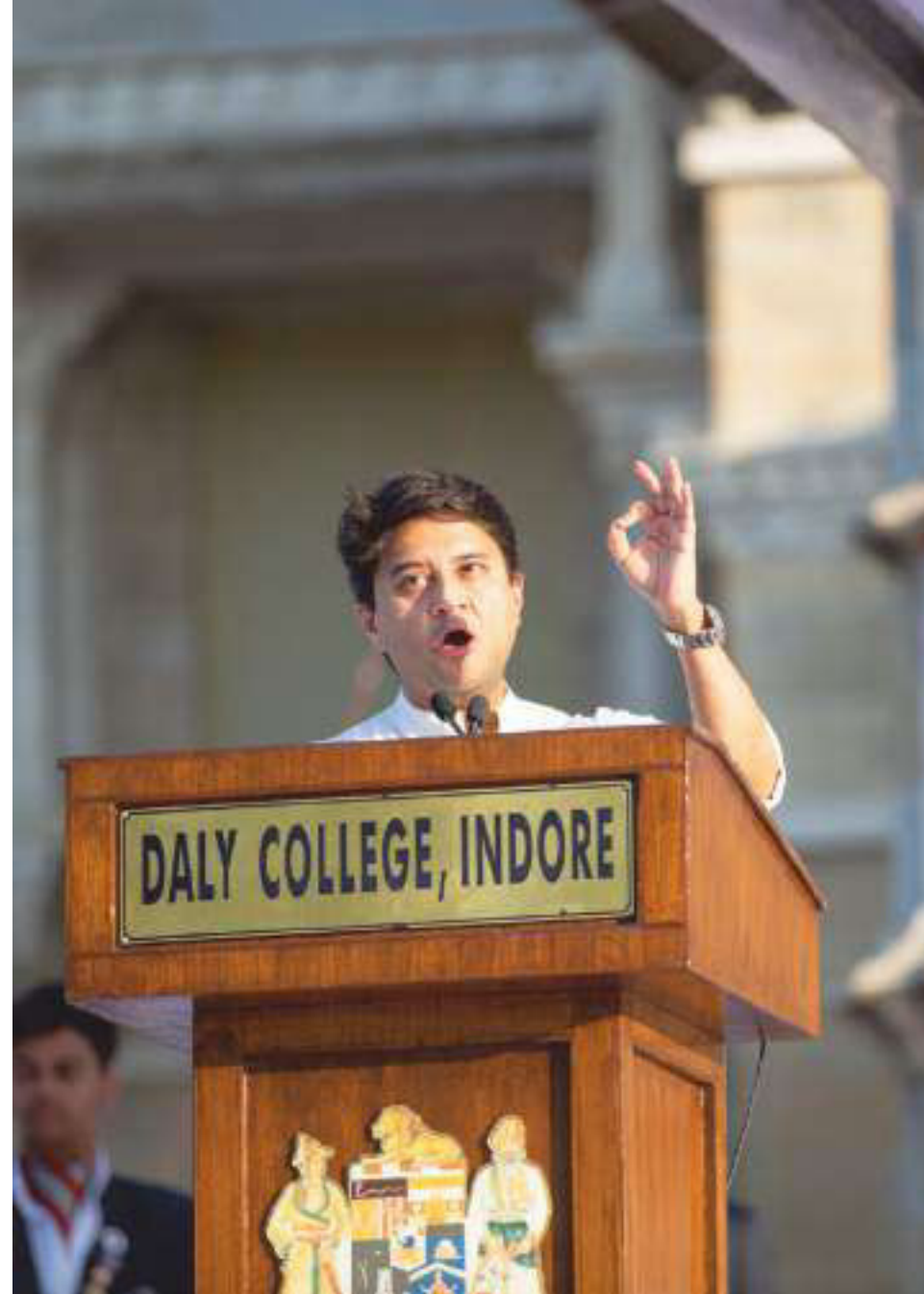
The final word of advice I'd like to give to you is -Always try and challenge yourself. Always try and do things that you have never been accustomed. Do things that you have never been accustomed to doing before. Try and make friends that are outside your comfort zone. Go and try subjects, courses and experiences that you possibly may think that you're not comfortable trying. Because it is through that iterative process that you will discover what is your true calling in life. And as George Bernard Shaw once said, "There are those that look at things the way they are and ask the question, Why? I dream of things that have never been and asked the question, why not?". So dream big. Challenge yourself. Push yourself out of your comfort zone. And in that iterative process, find the true calling and meaning in your life.

The final two words of advice I have for you, and that's from my own experience when I was at Stanford Business School. How many of you have heard of intel, the microchip that goes into computer machines? Okay, so I had the good fortune of being taught by the founder of intel, a gentleman by the name of Andy

Grove. He taught a course at Stanford Business School, which I happened to take. And on the last day of that course, when we walked into the classroom and at Stanford we have those double boards that are used, he said, "Today I'm not going to teach you all, anything. I have written something behind the second white, on the second whiteboard, behind the first whiteboard. And I'm going to walk out of this classroom and I want you all to read what I have written and remember, this for the rest of your lives in terms of whatever you do." And soon after he said that, he left the classroom. So a few of us scrambled towards the board and unveiled what he had written behind the first whiteboard on the second whiteboard. And there were four words written there, but they still ring true to me. And the four words that were written on that whiteboard were, "Only the paranoids survive." So be paranoid. I wake up in the morning everyday thinking, what is it that we should have been doing which we have not done? It is that challenge, that thirst, that urge to do better than before, that will always make you successful. And the final piece of advice that I'd like to give to you is that in life, I'm going to go back to where I started from. At the end of the day, always remember, try to be a good human being above all else. And the reason I say that to you is because at the end of a hard day's work, when you hit your bed and I bet it's something that all of you experience while you're at school because you're so damn tired between academics and the games field and everything else that you're doing. At least when I was in boarding school, I'd be out in five minutes. Always remember that the softest pillow is a clear conscience. So always try and have a clear conscience. Never think ill of anyone. Never think badly of anyone. Never try and bring anyone down.

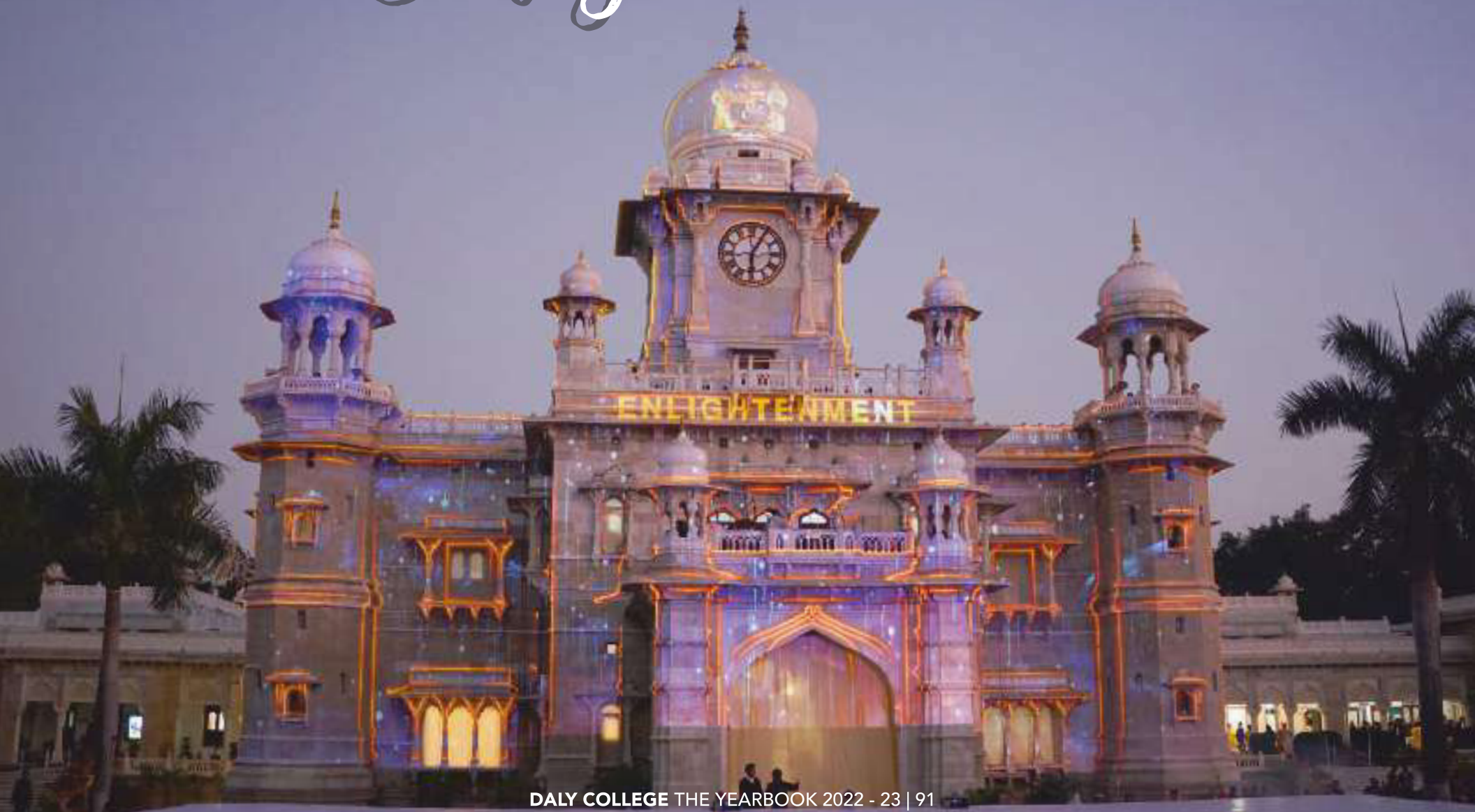

Enlightenment

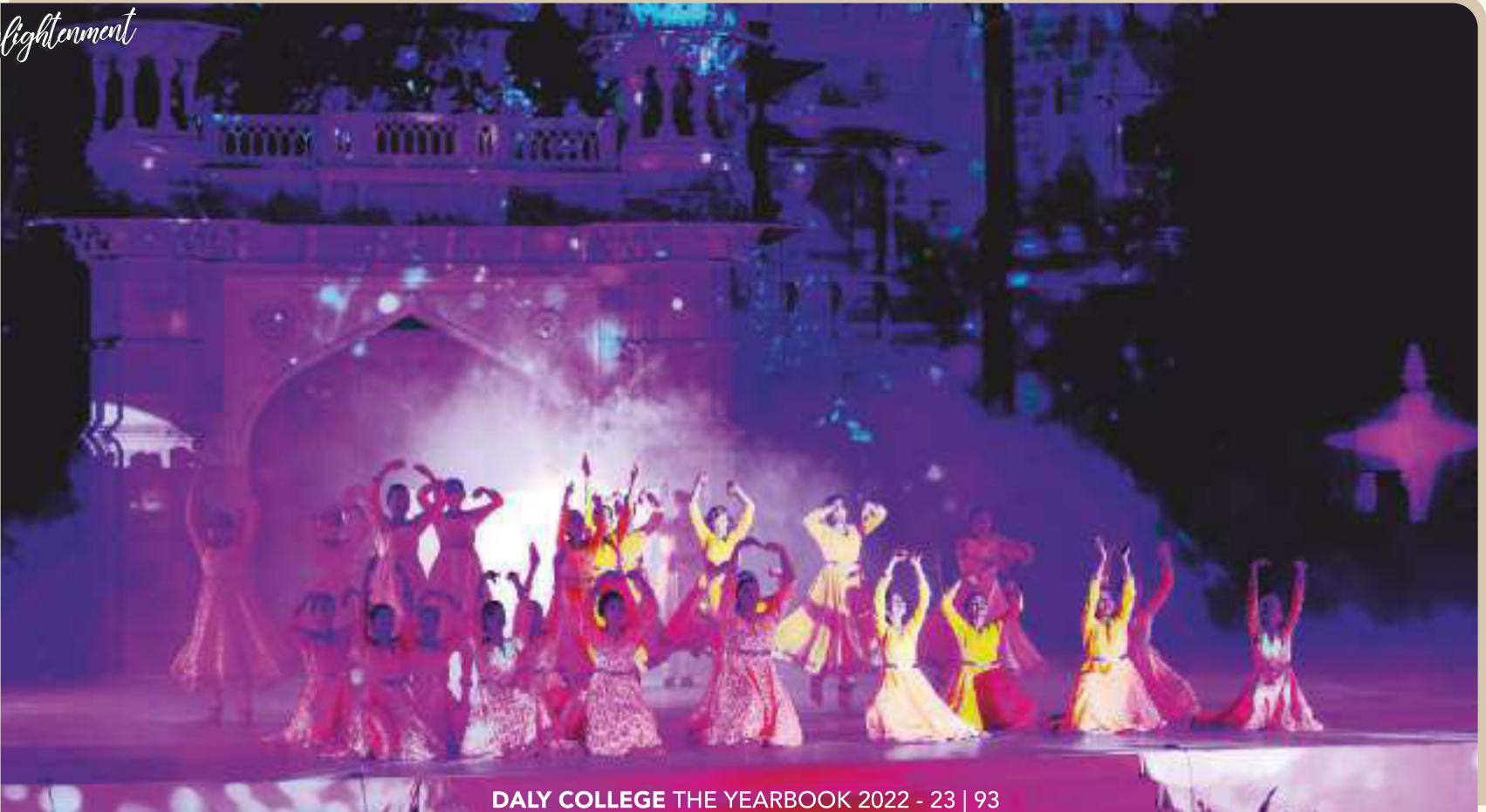

A show that was memorable, an applause that would ring in our ears for months, a moment that would stay in our hearts forever.



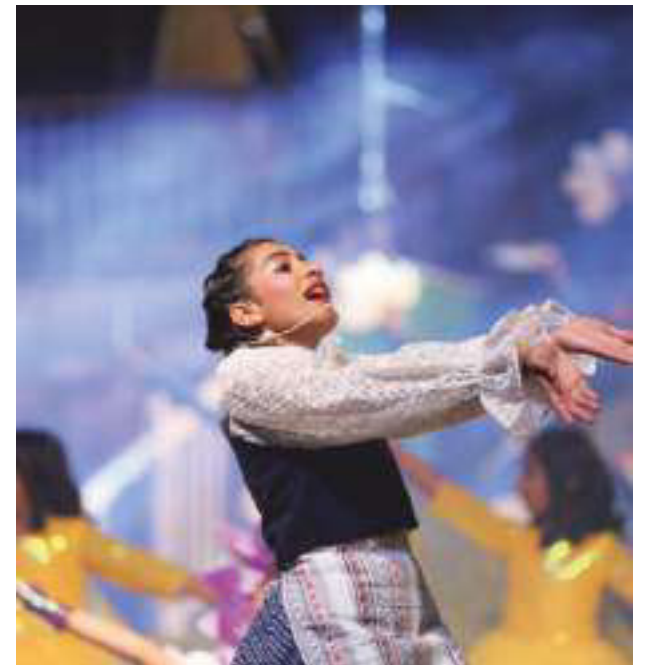

Sports Day was celebrated as a landmark event on the occasion of Children's Day. Each class participated in different races.

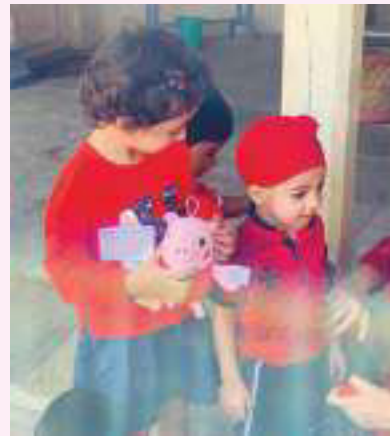

POTTERY

2022-23

As in pottery there are many different techniques and process, we were very keen to learn all these processes to shape the clay into functional products and turning it into a unique artform. We learned the basics of handling tools, such as functional and non-functional (terracotta pots), Wedging technique and its effects, Pinching technique without any tools, Freehand Slabbing technique, Thin Pots Throwing technique (shaping the clay on electric pottery wheel), Impression technique (Leaf impression, texture impression from natural tree bark), Texture Design technique, Product Detailing, firing temperature requirements (800 °C) and final technique which is applying glaze colour and firing its temperature (950 °C – 1000 °C).

Throughout the year, we successfully played with the medium of clay and created some wonderful potteries, functional and decorative. We earnestly thank our mentors for lending their expertise and making us what we are today!

environment CONFERENCES

2022

The students of Daly College attended two conferences related to the environment.

In August 2022, the first national conference on urban biodiversity conservation was organised by The Nature Volunteers, an NGO based in Indore. This was attended by five students. It was very informative and involved many urban planners and government officials who spoke at the conference. The students interacted with people working in the field of conservation in urban environments and urban ecology. The students also interacted with many old Dalians working to preserve urban biodiversity in Indore and other cities. The conference included a visit to one of the Ramsar Wetland sites at Sirpur Talab in Indore. Another conference, organised by the ELA Foundation based in Pune, and the Nature Volunteers took place in Indore in November 2022. It was a three-day basic certificate course in ornithology, which was attended by twenty-four students from classes 8 and 9. A wide range of topics such as avian adaptation for flight, bird migration, bird flight, conservation of owls and vultures, bird rescue and rehabilitation, and birds' breeding and nesting was discussed at the conference. Additionally, the students conducted bird-watching activities around Daly College. The conference also included a visit to another Ramsar Wetland site at Yashwant Sagar in Indore, which was indeed a learning experience.

This year the Social Service League based its actions on freedom from waste and worked on the Paper Recycling Unit. The DC Paper Recycling Plant was installed in 2004 to recycle and make paper from the used class work and homework notebooks of the children. Though it was inactive till 2020, students started showing a lot of interest thereafter and it was reopened with the support and guidance of teachers in-charge. To further this cause and free ourselves from litter and garbage lying around the campus, DC has installed waste-paper collection boxes in every building and boarding house. Children deposit waste paper at these points and they are collected periodically. All in all, the Social Service League has been very successful in creating awareness about freedom from waste.

2nd October, 2022

On the 2nd of October, DC celebrated the Social Service Day with the kids of Vama Shishu Vihar. The day was action-packed and full of vim and vigour with a lot of activities taking place in the school premises. After giving a warm welcome to the kids, they were taken to CTDC for a workshop on paper-bags and envelope making. It was a heartwarming sight to watch Dalians and Vama kids enjoy the learning session at the workshop and spend some cherishable moments. It helped them acquire the skills of reusing old newspapers and paper. The children relished the lip-smacking dishes that were offered to them. They were also made to print their hands on the poster that Dalians made as a memory of the first ever DC Social Service Day.

Soon after the workshop, the Vama kids presented a patriotic song which filled the air with goodness and was lauded by the Principal as well. The small kids also made cards for the Dalian volunteers. 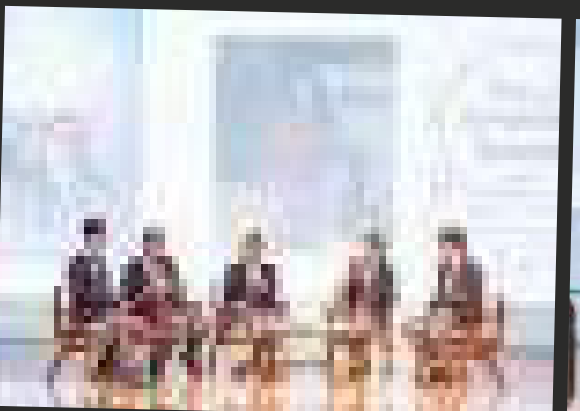
The Fest was also adorned with the presence of eminent authors. The event comprised myriad activities related to reading and literature.

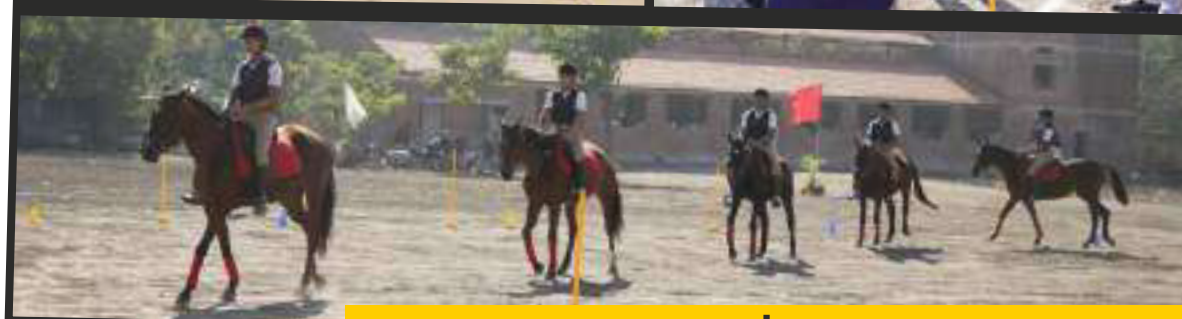


New Initiatives
