

ELECTIONS OF THE DALY COLLEGE SOCIETY

ORDER ON THE OBJECTIONS ON THE VOTERS LIST


DATED – 27.04.2026

A. BACKGROUND

1. The Daly College Society (*hereinafter referred to as "Society"*), vide minutes of meeting dated 31.03.2026, appointed me as the Election Officer to conduct the upcoming elections of the Society. The said minutes read as under:

"The Board was apprised of the communication dated 27/01/2026 issued by Assistant Registrar, Firms and Societies. As the extended term of the Board is expiring on 12/6/2026, the Board deliberated the matter and was not sure that in the light of legal proceedings wherein there is no clarity about Annual body and / or classes of elections to be held in terms of amendments in the bye laws of the Society, It was resolved to appoint a legal expert i.e., a retired high court judge as an Election Officer, by majority of 7 :1, it was decided to request and get acceptance from Mr. Sushil Gupta, Retired High Court Judge to be appointed as an Election Officer/ Returning Officer. He will be informed that as per existing byelaws of the society three categories of Members are to be elected through elections., viz., Founder donor, New donor and Old students of Daly College, whereas as per amended bye-laws, elections to only two categories are required viz., Founder donor and New donor. Further the election officer will be informed that the Board has already filed an application in Form IV before the Registrar for approval of the said amendments in byelaws which are pending consideration. In such circumstances let all decisions relating to elections including the categories for which election is to be held be taken by the election officer so appointed "

2. After having been appointed as the Election Officer, the Secretary of Society vide Communication dated 16/04/2026 forwarded this office list of voters under all three categories i.e 2 (b)(i) (Old Donors), 2 (b) (ii) (New Donors) and 2(c) (Old Students) ,thereafter election schedule was


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declared. A public notice inviting objections on the voters list was published in the newspaper '*Dainik Bhaskar*' on 21.04.2026 whereby objections were invited on the voters list till 23.04.2026. It is pertinent to mention that all three categories of voters list were made available at the website handle of daly college as well as officer of society Shri Om singh and were also affixed at the notice board of society.

3. Pursuant to receipt of objections, in person hearings were held in the office of election officer situated at Darbar hall Daly College on 24.04.2026 and 25.04.2026 where an opportunity was granted to all the objectors to make submissions in support of their objections.
4. Availing this opportunity, only a handful of the objectors (14 in No.) as per order sheets dated 24.04.2026 and 25.04.2026 appeared before me and advanced submissions in support of their objections.

B. OBJECTIONS

5. In pursuance of the public notice, a total of 921 objections were received which can be categorized as follows :-

C. DECISION ON OBJECTIONS

I. Objections Against Conducting Elections of 2(C) Category – 551 Objections

1.1. These objections have been raised against conducting the elections of 2(c) category i.e., the Old Dalians' category on two counts :-

- a) Amendments in the constitution of the Society; and
- b) Pendency of appellate proceedings before the Registrar, Firms and Societies, Bhopal (*hereinafter referred to as the "Registrar"*)

1.2. It is the contention of these objectors that as per the amended constitution of the Society there is no requirement of conducting any election for the 2(c) category as the already elected representatives of old Dalians Association will become a part of the Board of Governors. Thus, holding of fresh elections for this category will be a futile exercise which shall

unnecessarily result in wastage of time, money and resources, without serving any meaningful or productive purpose.

1.3. It is also the contention of these objectors that there exists ambiguity regarding the status and composition of members of the Society as the Assistant Registrar, Firms and Societies, Indore (*hereinafter referred to as the "Assistant Registrar"*), vide order dated 29.08.2025, directed the Society to amend its constitution to include all members of the Old Dalians' Association (*hereinafter referred to as the "ODA"*) as members of the Society. However, the said order has been stayed by the Registrar in appellate proceedings, which are pending adjudication. The objectors contend that in these circumstances, there is uncertainty as to whether the Old Dalians are to be regarded as full-fledged members of the Society or merely as voters. Thus, it is prayed that the elections for this category not be conducted till the pending appellate proceedings are conclusively decided.

1.4. Having gone through the objections and perused the record and heard some of the objectors in person, I am of the view that the objections raised by these objectors are liable to be decided as follows :-

- (i) As far as the amendments to the constitution of the Society are concerned, it is worthwhile to note that at the time of submission of the objections, the amendments were merely proposed in nature and had not been approved by the Registrar or the Assistant Registrar under Section 10 of the Madhya Pradesh Societies Registration Adhiniyam, 1973 (*hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1973"*). Thus, as per the scheme of the Act of 1973, particularly the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 10, the amendments were

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not valid and hence, could not have been a ground for not conducting the elections of 2(c) category.

However, during the hearing on objections, it has been brought to my notice, vide communication dated 24.04.2026 of secretary of society that the proposed amendments have in fact been registered by the Assistant Registrar under Section 10 of the Act of 1973 vide order dated 24.04.2026. It is settled law that once the amendments are registered, they are deemed to be valid and have come into force. Therefore, they are required to be followed strictly as the constitution / by-laws of any society is the supreme document governing its internal functioning.

Having perused the amended constitution / by-laws of the Society, I am satisfied that no election is required to be conducted for the 2(c) category (Old Dalians' category). Thus, the elections will be conducted only for two categories viz. 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category).

At this juncture, I deem it appropriate to deal with the question (though not having been raised in any of the objections), that whether amendments to the constitution of a society, if registered after the publication of election schedule, but before finalization of voters list will it be applicable to election process.

To deal with this issue, it is relevant to note that the amendments to the constitution / by-laws of the Society were in fact approved and submitted for registration much prior to the publication of


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election schedule. Further, at the time of appointment of the Election Officer, the Society specifically referred the question of the categories of the election to the Election Officer. Before any decision could be taken on this question, the amendments came to be approved and registered by the Registrar under the Act of 1973. The language of order dated 24.04.2026 registering the amendments makes it clear that the amendments are in force and are to be strictly applied. In such circumstances, I am of the view that although the election schedule has been declared but the election process has not yet begun as even the final voters list has not been published yet. More so in this peculiar case as the issue of categories for which election is required to be conducted had not been decided. In any case, the constitution / by-laws of the Society are sacrosanct and once the amendments are registered under the Act of 1973, they deem to come into force on that day and are required to be strictly adhered. In the present case bye laws of society have been amended before commencement of election Programme which starts only once voters list is finalized hence the newly amended bye laws will be applicable for present elections , since Conducting the elections on the basis of the earlier constitution / by-laws of the Society once the amended constitution / by-laws of the Society have come into force will be against the well settled principles of law as well as the scheme of the Act of 1973. Thus, I direct that the elections will be conducted in accordance with the amended constitution / by-laws of the Society.

- (ii) As far as the pendency of appellate proceedings before the Registrar is concerned, since I have already held that as per the amended

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constitution / by-laws there is no need to conduct elections for this category. I do not deem it fit to go into the merits of this objection.

II. Objections Regarding (i) Legal Validity & Notice Period; (ii) Electoral Categories; (iii) Voter List Transparency; (iv) Ballot Process; (v) Disproportionate Timeline; (vi) Procedural Consistency; and (vii) Incomplete Disclosure – 151 Objections

- 2.1. It is the contention of these objectors that the constitution of the Society provides for a 90 day election process but the election schedule reflects a significantly truncated timeline. It is also their contention that the public notice does not disclose electoral categories, their classification or voting rights but the voters list reflect the categories. It is also their contention that the voters lists have been published in parts and without consistent disclosure and that the notice indicates use of email / postal ballots without adequate explanation.
- 2.2. It is also the contention of these objectors that the timeline is disproportionate as the election schedule provides a wide window for the dispatch of ballots but an extremely limited window for their return. This creates an unequal opportunity to participate in the elections for the individuals situated outside India. Further, the sequence of nomination, scrutiny and withdrawal appears inconsistent with established electoral practice, potentially affecting informed participation and candidate clarity. It is also their contention that the key elements of the process including categories framework and even the public notice itself are not consistently available on the official website of the Society.

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- 2.3. In view of these objections and contentions, it has been prayed that the complete electoral framework and governing provisions be clearly disclosed, all electoral categories and voter lists be formally published and stabilised, ballot process be transparently explained with safeguards and timeline and procedural sequence be reviewed to ensure fair participation.
- 2.4. Having gone through the objections and perused the record, these objections are dealt with as follows :-

(i) Objection regarding Legal Validity and Notice Period

The only contention raised is that the constitution of the Society provides for a 90 day election process but the election schedule reflects a smaller timeline. Since having already held above that the elections of the Society will be held as per the amended constitution / by-laws, I do not find any merit in this objection for the reason that the amended constitution / by-laws of the Society do not provide for any such 90 day timeline. As far as the earlier constitution / by-laws are concerned, while it is true that Clause 11 provided that the election schedule is required to be published at least 90 days before the elections, the said clause was not mandatory and cannot be read in isolation; rather it must be read along with the other clauses.

The Society appointed me as the Election Officer only on 31.03.2026 whereas the term of the current Board of the Society was scheduled to expire on 13.06.2026. Therefore, in order to complete the elections before the expiry of the said deadline, by


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virtue of the power granted under Clause 15 of the earlier constitution / by-laws, I was inclined to prepare a fresh election schedule in order to conduct the elections. In any case, the present election schedule has been curated and published keeping in mind all possible factors with respect to the voters including their number, geographical location, and so on. The timelines provided in the present election schedule do not cause any prejudice to any of the voters or to any of the individuals wanting to contest the elections.

(ii) Objection regarding Electoral Categories

By raising this objection, the objectors have taken a contradictory plea as on one hand they content that the public notice does not disclose the electoral categories. However, on the other hand, they themselves admit that the categories have been reflected in the voters list. Thus, showing that no prejudice has been caused to the objectors. There is no mandatory requirement either under the law or under the constitution / by-laws of the Society that the categories of election must be published in the public notice.

In any case, as already held above, the elections are now required to be conducted only for two categories viz. 2(b)(i) (Founder Donors) and 2(b)(ii) (New Donors).

(iii) Objection regarding Voter List Transparency


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This objection raised by the objectors is entirely baseless for the reason that the voters list was duly published not just on the official website of the Society but also on the notice board of the Society for the purpose of inviting objections. In addition, the list was also available with the authorized representative of the Society, Mr. Om Singh, for perusal of the voters. All these details were duly provided in the public notice as well. The final voters list will be duly published on the official website of the Society as well as on the notice board of the Society after changes are made in accordance with this order. Thereby, evincing transparency at every stage.

(iv) Objection regarding Ballot Process

This objection has been raised against the use of email and postal ballots for the voters urging for uniformity of the process across the voters and also a concern has been raised regarding the handling and updating of email ids of the voters.

After having perused the amended constitution / by-laws of the Society, I am of the opinion that the constitution / by-laws provide for only one mode for dispatch of ballot papers i.e., by post. Thus, in my view, the mode of email cannot be used. Although the said mode was included in the election schedule as it is a recognized mode for delivery, but the constitution / by-laws of the Society do not permit the use of email. I, accordingly, direct the Secretary of the Society that all ballot papers will be dispatched to the voters by post. At this juncture, I deem it appropriate to request the Society to consider making amendments to its constitution / by-laws to


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provide for such delivery by email in order to further streamline the election process for future elections.


In light of this, the objection regarding the uniformity of the process and the handling and updating of email ids of the voters do not require any determination.

(v) Objection regarding Disproportionate Timeline

The crux of this objection is that the election schedule provides a wide window for dispatch of ballots but an extremely limited window for their return. In this regard, it is pertinent to clarify that the date for dispatch of ballot papers to all the outstation voters will be from 04.05.2026 to 09.05.2026. The date 09.05.2026 has been incorrectly mentioned as 19.05.2026 in the election schedule due to a typographical error. Thus, the period from 09.05.2026 till 20.05.2026 will be available for the return of duly filed and signed ballot papers back to the Secretary of the Society. Thereby, ensuring adequate time for the outstation voters to cast their votes.

(vi) Objection regarding Procedural Consistency

This objection has been raised with respect to the sequence of nomination process viz. nomination, withdrawal and scrutiny. There is no mandatory requirement either under law or under the constitution / by-laws of the Society prescribing a particular sequence for the nomination process. Hence, I do not find any infirmity in this sequence of calling nominations then providing an


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opportunity to withdraw nominations and then scrutinizing only those nomination forms that are left. No prejudice will be caused to any prospective candidate in this nomination process.

(vii) Objection regarding Incomplete Disclosure

This objection is baseless as all the elements of the process including the election schedule and the voters list are available on the official website and the notice board of the Society. Needless to mention, the final voters list will be duly published on the official website of the Society as well as on the notice board of the Society after changes are made in accordance with this order.

III. Objections Regarding Timeline of the Election – 14 Objections

- 3.1. These objections are to the effect that the constitution of the Society provides for a 90 day election process but the election schedule reflects a significantly truncated timeline.
- 3.2. These objections has already been decided in Paragraph 2.4 (i) above. Thus, the same decision will be applicable for these objectors as well. The contents of Paragraph 2.4(i) be deemed to be repeated herein for the sake of brevity.

IV. Objections Seeking Expulsion of Certain Individuals from the Old Dalians' Association – 152 objectors

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4.1. These objections have been raised seeking expulsion of Mr. Sandeep Parekh, Mr. Anurag Jain, Mr. Ranjit Namli and Mr. Manvir Bais from the Old Dalians' Association (*hereinafter referred to as the "ODA"*) on the ground that an FIR bearing Crime No. 38/2026 has been registered against them for the offence of cheating by personation under Section 319(2) of the BNS, 2023.

4.2. Having gone through the objections and perused the record and heard some of the objectors in person, I am of the view that the objections raised by these objectors are baseless as being not maintainable and they fall outside my jurisdiction as the Election Officer for the reason that the issues of membership and expulsion from a society are governed by the constitution / by-laws of that society. In this case, the ODA is a separate and independent society registered under the Act of 1973. The Election Officer of the Society (which is an entirely different society) will have no jurisdiction to decide the issue of expulsion of membership of certain members from the ODA.

V. Objections Regarding (i) Sequence of nomination process; (ii) Electoral Categories; and (iii) Timeline for ballots – 7 Objections

5.1. These objections have been raised against the sequence of nomination process viz. nomination, withdrawal and scrutiny as opposed to nomination, scrutiny and withdrawal. It has also been contended that the election notice does not mention the categories of elections. It has also been contended that sufficient time is required to be given for the return of ballot papers.

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5.2. The objections raised by these objectors have already been decided in Paragraphs 2.4(vi), 2.4(ii) and 2.4(v) above respectively. Thus, the same decision will be applicable for these objectors as well. The contents of Paragraphs 2.4(vi), 2.4(ii) and 2.4(v) be deemed to be repeated herein for the sake of brevity.

VI. Objections Regarding (i) Applicable Constitution / By-Laws; (ii) Electoral Categories; and (iii) Election Timeline – 8 Objections

6.1. These objections have been raised seeking a clarification as to whether the elections will be held as per the old constitution / by-laws or the new amended constitution / by-laws and as to for which categories the elections will be held. Further, it has been contended that the timeline / duration of the elections has been reduced from 90 days to 30 days.

6.2. The first two issues viz. the applicable constitution / by-laws and the categories for which elections are to be held has already been decided in Paragraph 1.4 (i) above. The contents of the said Paragraph be deemed to be repeated herein for the sake of brevity.

6.3. The third issue viz. the timeline / duration of the elections has also already been decided in Paragraph 2.4(i) above. The contents of the said Paragraph be deemed to be repeated herein for the sake of brevity.

VII. Objections Regarding Updation of Details in Voters' List – 26 Objections

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- 7.1. These objections have been raised for updation / change in personal details such as address, contact number, house number and ODA number of the objectors in the voters list.
- 7.2. Since the elections are required to be held only for the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category), no action is required with respect to the objections that pertain to the 2(c) category (Old Dalian category).
- 7.3. As far as the other two categories are concerned, after having gone through the record, I hereby direct the Secretary of the Society to incorporate the changes in addresses, contact numbers, and House numbers, as provided by these objectors in the final voters list for the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category) within 3 days from today after asking for proof of change in addresses, contact numbers and House numbers,.

VIII. Objections Regarding Inclusion of Name in Voter's List – 6 Objections

- 8.1. Six objections have been received seeking inclusion of nine names in the voters list. Out of these nine names, three¹¹ pertain to the 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category), two¹² pertain to the 2(c) category (Old Dalian

category) and four¹³ pertain to the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category).

8.2. Since the elections are required to be held only for the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category), no action is required with respect to the objections that pertain to the 2(c) category (Old Dahan category).

8.3. As far as the three names pertaining to the 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category) are concerned, they are not supported by any documents , thus I am satisfied that their names cannot be included in the voter's list.

8.4. As far as the four names pertaining to the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) are concerned, after having perused the records of the Society, I am satisfied that the names of Mr. Nawab Kazim Ali Khan and Mrs. Chandra Kumari Baghel (Bada Barkheda family) deserve to be included in the voters list. Accordingly, I direct the Secretary of the Society to include the names of these two individuals in the final voters list for the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category).

IX. Objections Regarding Deletion of Names in the Voters' List – 3 Objections

9.1. Three objections have been received seeking deletion of certain names in the voters list on the ground that these voters have expired but still their

name is being reflect in the list. Out of these three objections, two¹⁴ objections pertain to the 2(c) category (Old Dalian category) and one¹⁵ pertains to the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category).

9.2. Since the elections are required to be held only for the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category), no action is required with respect to the objections that pertain to the 2(c) category (Old Dalian category).

9.3. As far as the objection regarding deletion of names in the 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) is concerned, the objection is not supported by any evidence such as the death certificate or any other document evincing the factum of death of these individuals. After having perused the record of the Society, I am of the view that no such document evincing the death of these individuals is available on record. Thus, in such circumstances, their names cannot be deleted from the voters list in the absence of any evidence.

X. Miscellaneous Objections – 1 Objection

10.1. In addition to the aforesaid objections, one objection has been preferred by Mr. Sandeep Parekh in the form of a representation. Although, the other objections preferred by Mr. Sandeep Parekh have already been dealt with in the categories above, it is necessary to decide the objections raised in the representation.

10.2. This objector has contended that the amendments made to the constitution / by-laws of the Society are arbitrary, whimsical, sweeping and undemocratic such that they strike at the root of the established governance structure of the Society. Further, it has been contended that election should not be conducted on the basis of such unregistered, disputed and illegal amendments.

10.3. After having gone through the objections and perusing the record, I am of the view that the objections cannot be sustained at this stage for the reason that the amendments to the constitution / by-laws of the Society have already been approved by the Registrar under Section 10 of the Act of 1973. Thus, once the amendments are registered, they are deemed to be valid and have come into force. I, being the Election Officer, cannot go into the validity or legality of the amendments. The prayer that elections not be conducted as per the unregistered constitution / by-laws has been rendered infructuous as the constitution / by-laws have been registered.

XI. **Foot Note appended to voters list of 2 (b) (ii) New Donors category**
Though No objection have been received regarding the same but on asking from secretary she has informed that all new donors who were made donors by Board of governors under 2 (b) (ii) new donors category in meeting of Board of governors dated 31/03/2026, there banking instruments were under transaction and now cheques given by 25 persons have been dishonored out of which 14 persons have made bank transfers as regards which, I am of the considered opinion that all those persons whose amount of donation is not received cannot be treated as donors or voters under 2 (b) (ii) category, I therefore direct secretary to delete there name as voters/donors.

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D. CONCLUSION

In light of the aforesaid decisions on the objections received on the voters list, I direct the Secretary of the Society to publish the final voters list for 2(b)(i) category (Founder Donors category) and 2(b)(ii) category (New Donors category) on the official website and notice board of the Society. The election process will continue as per the election schedule.

**GUIDELINES FOR ELECTIONS TO BOG OF THE DALY COLLEGE
2026 AS DIRECTED BY HON'BLE ELECTION OFFICER**

As Regards Nomination Form

- (i) Each candidate can take two Nomination forms either in person or by sending his authorised agent with a copy of original Authorisation.
- (ii) Nomination Forms are not Transferrable and candidates in whose name nomination form is issued has to fill the form and return duly filled form to Secretary of society
- (iii) Each Candidate will be required to present the nomination form to secretary of society duly filled in person with a copy of Age Proof.

As Regards Voting

- (i) That all voters will enter from Gyan Dwar after due verification and after voting will exit from Shakti Dwar.
- (ii) The College will provide electric vehicles between parking place and polling station to ferry elderly and physically challenged voters.
- (iii) Ramp access and Wheel Chair will be provided at the polling centres. Waiting area (tents and seating) will be created at each polling centre.
- (iv) Any person creating indiscipline in the campus will be removed from the campus and a proper action as per law will be taken against the person.
- (v) That there will be one polling booth for 2(b) (i) old Donors Category and two polling Stations for 2(b) (ii) New Donors Category
- (vi) Ballot papers of blue colour will be printed for postal ballots with envelope also of blue colour and regular ballot be printed in white colour.

- (vii) One representative of the Election Officer will be present inside each Polling Station during the entire duration of polling
- (viii) One representative of each candidate will be permitted to sit at the counter from where slips are being issued at a time. Names of two representatives are to be given by the candidates.
- (ix) All shall maintain decorum befitting the school and be polite and patient with the staff on duty and follow their instructions. Canvassing is NOT allowed anywhere within the campus by anybody.
- (x) Each candidate will be permitted to depute two Polling Agents per Polling Station. However, at a given time only one Polling Agent per candidate per polling station will be allowed. Two photographs of the Polling Agent along with his/her ID proof and contact details should be submitted to Daly College Office three days in advance to polling date.
- (xi) There shall be two tables at entrance of Darbar Hall and one at entrance of resource centre from where the voter will be issued a voter's slip after due verification through either Aadhar Card, PAN Card, Ration Card, Election commission identity card, Passport or any identity card issued by any Govt. Department or Driving License
- (xii) The voter then moves inside the Darbar Hall / Resource Centre to any of the table(s) to collect his/her ballot paper after putting his/ her signature on the counterfoil of the ballot and after due verification.
- (xiii) The voter then goes to the enclosure and puts a tick (✓) mark against candidate(s) and drops the ballot paper in the ballot box kept on the table duly signed by election officer.
- (xiv) Mobiles are strictly prohibited in Darbar Hall and Resource Centre.
- (xv) Voting will take place from 9 A.M to 5 P.M.

- (xvi) One Police constable / Security Guard will be placed at each polling booth to ensure that no photographs of ballots are taken while casting votes.
- (xvii) Notices will be placed at the entrance to say that cameras or any other gadget which has got cameras are not allowed inside the polling booth.
- (xviii) Counting will first start of postal ballots at 5.15 PM and then other ballots
- (xix) Postal ballots with envelopes will be kept in locked ballot Box under signature of election officer which will be opened in his presence and presence of candidates only.
- (xx) Manshi Mishra, Sushil Yadav, Rashmi Ahuja, Manmeet Arora, Chetan Sachdeva, Gajendra Singh employees of Daly college and any other employee authorised by secretary will be considered on election duty.
- (xxi) At the time of counting either candidate or one of his / her representative duly authorised by candidate will be allowed on each counting table.
- (xxii) Staff assigned duty will first make bundles of 25 ballots each.
- (xxiii) Then counting will start and votes obtained by each candidate will be entered in the sheet.
- (xxiv) Once the outstation ballots are counted, the local ballots will be taken for counting, first by making bundles of 25 ballots each.
- (xxv) Then counting of local ballots will start and votes obtained by each candidate in each round will be entered in the sheet.
- (xxvi) Manual counting as well as computer entry will be made for each round of 100 ballots per round
- (xxvii) Once counting is over, the total number of votes received by each candidate will be entered in the sheet.

- (xxviii) The Election Officer will then make the announcement of total votes received by each candidate and subsequently the winner's name.
- (xxix) After declaring this, the Election Officer will write the name of the winner and then sign on the sheet.
- (xxx) Two candidates or their representatives will also be asked to sign sheet as witness.
